Your UNM main campus application is separate from branch campuses.

Complete your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

Online at fafsa.ed.gov or on paper as soon as possible.

List your UNM branch campus so they receive a record of your financial need to determine the financial aid they can offer, including scholarships and grants.

Get to know UNM's [core curriculum](#)

Completing these required classes will save you time and money; use this as a guide for registration. [Core curriculum for business degrees](#) is slightly different.

Register for 12 credit hours (full-time)

In order to qualify for the Bridge Scholarship** your first semester and the Lottery Scholarship every semester thereafter (for students starting immediately after high school graduation), you must be enrolled full-time and maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher.
